Following an investment of nearly £1million at the Tarmac Silverlands Stadium and under the steer of a dynamic Board led by Chairman David Hopkins, Buxton Football Club has ambition and intent to progress, and now boasts one of the best 4G pitches in Europe.

As part of this programme, our highest performing academy players will be selected to train and potentially begin integration into the First Team. In Paul Philips, Buxton FC has one of the youngest and most progressive First Team managers in the Northern Premier League. Paul is **committed to developing young talented players** and regularly fields one of the youngest average age teams in the Northern Premier League. In addition, for those students with an interest in progressing into backroom staff/coaching, this programme offers an abundance of opportunities, including analysis and coaching badges.

The Course

UNIVERSITY PATHWAYS

This programme offers the opportunity to complete a Level 3 Extended Diploma thanks to our partnership with Buxton & Leek College part of the University of Derby, rated. This programme is equivalent to 3 A Levels with **up to 168 UCAS points awarded**. This is a credible, and in some ways preferable, post 16 study route for many, when compared to staying on at school to sit A Levels. Not every person enjoys the school environment or performs well in exams.

The majority of this programme is coursework-based and it is realistically more than possible to actually outperform A-level students in terms of UCAS points gained. Please see the grade comparison table to help you calculate points and compare with the A-level route. **Sports Science**, **Sports Performance**, **and Physiotherapy** are obvious progression degree routes and most universities welcome candidates from this programme. However, other diverse degree routes are possible including **Business Studies**. To find out more, search the entry criteria for the degree and university you may be interested in (entry criteria including UCAS points).

Common Misconceptions Answered

Myth 1: "Bright/able students don't do this sort of programme"

Fact: The educational aspect of this academy programme (Extended Level 3 in Sport) is respected by universities and in widespread delivery across colleges and academies throughout the UK. It attracts many highly able candidates and it is possible to gain up to 168 UCAS points. You would need to score 3 A* grades at A Level to match that score.

Myth: 2: "This will limit my child's opportunities of going to University"

Fact: An Extended Level 3 is the equivalent of 3 A Levels. Three A Levels at B grade are worth 120 UCAS points and an Extended Level 3 with three Distinctions is worth 144 UCAS points. Three A Levels at C grade are worth 96 UCAS points and three Merits are worth 96 UCAS points. It is possible to get 168 UCAS points with 3 Distinction stars on this course.

Fact: In general, students usually drop a grade between GCSE and A Level due to the increased difficulty, so if you are predicted grade 6/7s at GCSE (formerly Bs), statistically a student is likely to gain 3Cs at A Level. Excellent results in this programme are highly achievable with hard work, aided by the fact that it is majority coursework-based.

Fact: According to Which? 95% of universities now accept Extended Level 3 qualifications including Russell Group universities. You can study non sports related degrees as well as sports fields. Examples at Manchester Met University include Business Studies, Sports Science, and Sports Coaching & Development, all of which require a very achievable 104 UCAS points (DMM). To be clear, this programme is suitable for all sports related degree programmes, but there are many non sports related degree fields where the entry requirements are not subject specific. Please contact individual university admissions teams to discuss the degree you are interested in studying

Myth 3: "This is only for aspiring professional footballers"

Fact: Football is an important practical part of this programme, however many students attend similar programmes to prepare for careers in elite sports (coaching, physiotherapy, analysis), fitness & leisure, and non-sports related industries. Progression to both sports and non-sports degrees are common outcomes.

Myth 4: "Extended Diplomas are inferior to A levels"

Fact: Extended Diplomas offer a different route to work and higher education and when integrated into academy type programmes they have several advantages. Unlike continuing at school for A levels, this programme requires discipline, analytical skills and teamwork as students work in an elite sport performance environment with high expectations. These are rare skills in young people and in high demand by employers but not always developed in a larger sixth-form environment. What stories will your child be able to tell during future job interviews...?

Myth 6: "The education is secondary to playing football"

Fact: Teaching contact time on our course is similar to that of a three A Level programme. The training, preparation and matches are all completed in time over and above the important core education component and coaches exercise the right to withhold access to training sessions if academic targets are not being met. This programme is designed to enable not limit future opportunities.

Myth 7: "This scheme uses inferior teaching and facilities"

Fact: Unlike many academies, Buxton FC have committed to a high-quality academic teacher-led experience as opposed to sitting students in front of eLearning. Significant use of IT, media and performance analysis will be incorporated including player video & PlayerTeK GPS analysis, heat-mapping, and more. Over £1million has been invested in facilities, staff and technology. Our brand new teaching facility incorporated within the stadium using the latest technology, makes us one of the best football and education providers outside of the football league.
